

Annex 3: Eligibility Criteria at a glance

Please note that the table below is designed to help you verifying whether you meet the eligibility criteria described in section 7 of this guide. All applicants and applications for the New European Bauhaus Prizes must satisfy all the detailed criteria outlined in this guide.

Relation to the submitted Strand and Category	<i>Does the applicant clearly refer to the prize category and strand that they apply for in their application form?</i>	✓/ X
Three core values and three working principles of the New European Bauhaus	<i>Does the application explain how the project or concept integrates and promotes the New European Bauhaus values and working principles, and how they will improve people's and communities' life in the longer term.</i>	✓/ X
Relation to the location	<i>Does the application relate to a concrete location/region, have a clear target group, and clearly defined objective(s). Does the application reflect on</i>	✓/ X

Replicability	<i>Can the project/concept be implemented or applied in a different locality than the one where it originates from?</i>	✓/ X
Maturity	<p><i>Does the application fulfil the following requirements regarding maturity (progress of implementation) to be evidenced by documents attached to the application form:</i></p> <p>Projects under strand A must have already been fully completed at the time of the application. Fully completed would indicate that there are no missing components to the project (be it physical/tangible or intangible components). Processes, tools, business models, methods etc. need to have been fully developed by the time of application. Projects in this strand need to have been implemented or applied in at least one specific case.</p> <p>Concepts under strand B can be at different stages of development, from the early concepts to prototype level, and should be presented with a development plan, outlining the foreseen steps envisaged to further develop, promote and/or implement the concept with a particular focus on the year following the application.</p>	✓/ X
Documentary evidence of level of maturity	<p><i>Does the application include evidence of level of maturity, results, progress in implementation, with the appropriate documentary evidence attached to the application:</i></p> <p>Strand A: the application should detail achieved results and outputs of completed projects, e.g. evaluation report, final project report, relevant certification, etc.</p> <p>Strand B: the application should demonstrate a commitment to implement the concept in practice by including a development plan, detailing the steps foreseen for the further development and implementation of the concept.</p>	✓/ X
